



the Truth of the Last Days

Three Stages of the Gospel

May God's overflowing blessings be on all servants of the Lord and saints around the world who are faithfully fulfilling the words of Christ Jesus to establish the Kingdom of God on earth.

Throughout the entire history of mankind, in every age, the Lord God has made His will known in advance to His people through prophets:

“ Surely the Sovereign LORD does nothing without revealing his plan to his servants the prophets.” (Amos 3:7)

Jesus teaches that a true servant of God must provide his people with food at the proper time:

*“ Who then is the faithful and wise servant, whom the master has put in charge of the servants in his household to **give them their food at the proper time**? It will be good for that servant whose master finds him doing so when he returns.” (Matt. 24:45-46)*

The Book of Ecclesiastes says:

*“ **There is a time for everything**, and a season for every activity under heaven.” (Eccl. 3:1)*

The Book of Revelation testifies that God rules over time and exists at the same time in the past, the present, and the future:

*“ Grace and peace to you from him who is, and who was, **and who is to come**...” (Rev. 1:4)*

This is absolutely true. Every life and all matter on this earth exist within three aspects of time. In the same way, the Bible speaks of the Gospel from three time perspectives.

We have chosen to call this “**the Three Stages of the Gospel**”. This is a timely message for our age, because the last day is already near.



The First Stage of the Gospel



What Is the Gospel?

The Gospel is the good news about Jesus Christ. The Messiah promised by God came to this earth, shed His blood on the cross, and by doing so redeemed sinners for salvation.

The first coming of Jesus Christ two thousand years ago marked the beginning of **the first stage of the Gospel**, which the Bible calls **the Gospel of the Kingdom of Heaven**.

The first person to proclaim the coming of the Messiah to the world was John the Baptist:

“In those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the wilderness of Judea and saying, ‘Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near.’” (Matt. 3:1-2)

At the age of thirty, Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist, and from that moment He began His mission. The very first message Jesus Christ preached was the good news of the Kingdom of Heaven:

“From that time on Jesus began to preach, ‘Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near.’” (Matt. 4:17)

What does “The Kingdom of Heaven is near” mean?

1. It is the good news of the first coming of Jesus Christ, who Himself is the Kingdom of Heaven: *“But if I drive out demons by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God has come upon you.”* (Matt.12:28)
2. To accept Jesus Christ means to accept the Kingdom of God: *“...The kingdom of God does not come with your careful observation,... because the kingdom of God is within you.”* (Luke 17:20-21)
3. And the only way into the Kingdom of Heaven is through Jesus Christ alone: *“Jesus answered, ‘I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.’”* (John 14:6)

For Whom Was the Gospel of the Kingdom of Heaven Prepared?

Jesus first preached **the Gospel of the Kingdom of Heaven** in the synagogues:

*“Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching **in their synagogues**, preaching the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness...”* (Matt. 9:35, 4:23)

It is very important to note that at that time Jesus limited His mission only to the land of Israel:

*“These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: ‘Do not go among the Gentiles or enter any town of the Samaritans. **Go rather to the lost sheep of Israel.**’”* (Matt.10:5-6)

Jesus Christ clearly stated that the purpose of His coming was first of all to bless the people of Israel:

“ He answered, I was sent only to the lost sheep of Israel.” (Matt.15:24)

Thus, the **Gospel of the Kingdom of Heaven** was a great spiritual blessing originally prepared by God for the people of Israel.

However, in their desire for material prosperity, the people of Israel rejected this spiritual blessing. Because of this, Jesus was deeply angered:

“When it was almost time for the Jewish Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple courts he found men selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at tables exchanging money. So he made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple area, both sheep and cattle; he scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. To those who sold doves he said, ‘Get these out of here! How dare you turn my Father’s house into a market!’” (John 2:13-16)



In the end, a terrible tragedy befell the people of Israel - they crucified Jesus on the cross and handed over the Son of God to death.

With this, the first stage of the Gospel of the Kingdom of Heaven, prepared by the Lord God for the people of Israel, came to an end.

Yet the great plan of the Creator and Lord of all that exists in this world -for the salvation of all humanity- continued to move forward.

The Second Stage of the Gospel



After the crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ, a great miracle took place - He rose again on the third day.

This marked the beginning of **the second stage of the Gospel**, which the Bible calls **the Gospel of God’s Grace**:

“For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith - and this is not from your selves, it is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast.” (Eph. 2:8-9)

Salvation is a priceless gift from the Lord God. It is not given because of human merit, but solely by God’s grace:

*“This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and **all are justified freely by his grace** through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus.” (Rom. 3:22-24)*

The Apostle Paul, who encountered Jesus in the Spirit after His ascension into heaven, called himself **an apostle of the Gospel of God’s Grace**:



*“However, I consider my life worth nothing to me; my only aim is to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me - the task of testifying to **the good news of God’s grace.**” (Acts 20:24)*

For Whom Was the Gospel of God’s Grace Prepared?

From the moment of the resurrection of Jesus Christ after His crucifixion on the cross, the spiritual blessing of the Kingdom of Heaven was opened to all people. The Lord commanded His disciples:

*“He said to them, ‘**Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation.**’” (Mark 16:15)*

At the same time, Jesus instructed them:

*“Therefore go and **make disciples of all nations**, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” (Matt. 28:19)*

After His resurrection, Jesus Christ remained on earth with the apostles for forty days. Before ascending into heaven, He instructed them:



*“...Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and **you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.**” (Acts 1:4-8)*

In obedience to Jesus’ command, the disciples remained in Jerusalem and prayed fervently until they received the Holy Spirit:

“When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place... All of

*them **were filled with the Holy Spirit** and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.” (Acts 2:1-4)*

After the apostles of Jesus Christ received the Holy Spirit, the history of the mission of the **Gospel of God’s Grace** began - the spreading of the truth of salvation throughout the whole world among many languages, tribes, and nations, in order to form a spiritual Israel:

*“He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. Yet to all who did receive him, **to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God** - children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband’s will, but born of God.” (John 1:11-13)*

The Third Stage of the Gospel



At this present time, the truth of the Gospel of God’s Grace has already been preached in all countries, and the Holy Word of God - the Bible - has been translated into nearly all the languages of the world. Today, there is practically no place on earth where people have not heard of or do not know about Jesus Christ. So what comes next?

*“And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, **and then the end will come.**”* (Matt. 24:14)

What does “The End Will Come” mean?

The disciples of Jesus Christ asked Him what the end of the world would be like:

*“As Jesus was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to him privately. ‘Tell us,’ they said, ‘when will this happen, and **what will be the sign of your coming and of the end of the age?**’”* (Matt. 24:3)

From these words, we know that the most important event of the end of the world will be the **second coming of Jesus Christ**.

So, dear friends, the Lord has prepared new **“food in due season”** for the last days, in order to prepare the spiritual world for the second coming of Jesus Christ. This is the third stage of the Gospel, which the Bible calls **the Everlasting Gospel**:

*“And I saw another angel fly in the midst of heaven, having the **the everlasting gospel** to preach unto them that dwell on the earth, and to every nation, and kindred, and tongue, and people,”* (Rev. 14:6, KJV)

The truth of the Everlasting Gospel is spreading with great speed and is reaching the entire globe instantly. This message is being carried through the air by radio waves, television, the internet, satellite communication, and all kinds of modern mass media.

The message of the Everlasting Gospel is a truth that must be proclaimed anew in the last days, in order to warn all believers in Jesus Christ about the events that are about to take place:

*“And he said unto me, Thou must **prophecy again** before many peoples, and nations, and tongues, and kings.”* (Rev. 10:11, KJV)

This truth was hidden until an appointed time, but now the moment of its revelation has come:

*“...Then the angel I had seen standing on the sea and on the land raised his right hand to heaven. And he swore by him who lives for ever and ever... and said, ‘There will be no more delay! But in the days when the seventh angel is about to sound his trumpet, **the mystery of God will be accomplished**, just as he announced to his servants the prophets.’”* (Rev. 10:1-7)

The Everlasting Gospel message has three important points:

*“He said in a loud voice, **Fear God** and give him glory, **because the hour of his judgment has come. Worship him who made** the heavens, the earth, the sea, and the springs of waters.”* (Rev. 14:7)

The First Point **Fear God**

The Bible teaches us what it means to fear God:

*“**The fear of the Lord is to hate evil;**”* (Prov. 8:13)

*“**...through the fear of the Lord a man avoids evil.**”* (Prov. 16:6)

Many Christians ask in confusion, “Why should we fear God? Is not God love?” However, we must not forget that the God who loves us by nature is also **a God of justice**.

God is just, and therefore He both shows **mercy** and brings **judgment**:

*“And he passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, ‘The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin. **Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished...**”*
(Exod. 34:6-7)

The mercy of God’s justice declares that every person has the opportunity to receive forgiveness, salvation, and the love of the Lord God:

*“For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that **whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.**”* (John 3:16)

At the same time, **the judgment of God’s justice** warns that at the end of the world the Lord will judge every person according to his deeds:

*“And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne, and books were opened. Another book was opened, which is the book of life. The dead were judged according to what they had done as recorded in the books... Each person was **judged according to what they had done.**”*
(Rev. 20:12-13)

At **His first coming**, Jesus fulfilled the merciful side of God’s justice:

“...For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners.” (Matt. 9:13)

But at **His second coming**, the Lord will come as Judge, to carry out the judgment of God’s justice:

“...God judges people’s secrets through Jesus Christ, as my gospel declares.” (Rom. 2:16)

The Second Point

The Hour of God’s Judgment Has Come

Therefore, Jesus Christ will come a second time to carry out God’s judgment:

*“In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, **who will judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I give you this charge.**”*
(2 Tim. 4:1)

The authority to judge has been given by God Himself to the coming Jesus Christ:

*“Moreover, the Father judges no one, **but has entrusted all judgment to the Son.**”*
(John 5:22)

The purpose of **the Gospel of God’s Grace** is to give every person who believes in Jesus Christ the opportunity to receive salvation. The purpose of **the Everlasting Gospel** is to warn all who believe in Him about the coming of the Lord and the approaching judgment of God.



Whom Will the Lord Judge?

The prophet Isaiah declares that the Lord’s anger is against all nations:

“The LORD is angry with all nations; his wrath is on all their armies. He will totally destroy them, he will give them over to slaughter.” (Isa. 34:2)

Many Christians are mistaken in thinking that God will judge only unbelievers. The apostle Peter warns us that judgment begins with God’s chosen people:

“For it is time for judgment to begin with God’s household; and if it begins with us, what will the outcome be for those who do not obey the gospel of God? And, ‘If it is hard for the righteous to be saved, what will become of the ungodly and the sinner?’” (1Pet. 4:17-18)

The prophet Ezekiel also testifies that the Lord’s judgment begins with God’s own people:

*“And said to him, ‘Go throughout the city of Jerusalem and put a mark on the foreheads of those who grieve and lament over all the detestable things that are done in it.’ As I listened, he said to the others, ‘Follow him through the city and kill, without showing pity or compassion. Slaughter the old men, the young men and women, the mothers and children, but do not touch anyone who has the mark. **Begin at my sanctuary.**’ So they began with the old men who were in front of the temple.” (Ezek. 9:4-6)*

Why was the Lord angry with His People?

*“While they were killing and I was left alone, I fell facedown, crying out, ‘Alas, Sovereign LORD! Are you going to destroy the entire remnant of Israel in this outpouring of your wrath on Jerusalem?’ He answered me, ‘**The sin of the people of Israel and Judah is exceedingly great; The land is full of bloodshed and the city is full of injustice. They say, ‘The LORD has***

forsaken the land; the LORD does not see.’ So I will not look on them with pity or spare them, but I will bring down on their own heads what they have done.” (Ezek. 9:8-10)

Jesus Himself warns us clearly:

*“Not everyone who says to me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ will enter the kingdom of heaven, **but only the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven...**” (Matt. 7:21-27)*

“In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead... As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead.” (Jas. 2:17, 26)

The Third Point

Worship ONLY God, who created heaven and earth, the sea, and the springs of water

The world began to exist at the moment it was created by the Lord God.

The end of existence is the judgment of the Lord:

“I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End.” (Rev. 22:13)

Everything began from the Lord, exists through Him, and returns to Him:

“For from him and through him and for him are all things” (Rom. 11:36)

Therefore, we must worship only God, who created this entire world, and serve only the Lord, who at the end of time will judge the whole world.



For what will the Lord God judge the world?

From the very beginning, the Lord warned the people of Israel:

*"...I am the LORD your God... You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an image in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; **for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God...**" (Exod. 20:1-5)*

The Lord God strictly warned that in the end times all idolatry will be brought to judgment and severely punished:

"I will pronounce my judgments on my people because of their wickedness in forsaking me, in burning incense to other gods and in worshiping what their hands have made." (Jer. 1:16)

In Revelation it is written what fate awaits idolaters:

"Outside are the dogs, those who practice magic arts, the sexually immoral, the murderers, the idolaters and everyone who loves and practices falsehood." (Rev. 22:15)

"But the cowardly, the unbelieving, the vile, the murderers, the sexually immoral, those who practice magic arts, the idolaters and all liars - they will be consigned to the fiery lake of burning sulfur. This is the second death." (Rev. 21:8)

In this world there exist countless idols that turn human hearts away from the Lord God. (Ezek. 38, 39; Acts 4:11-12; Rev. 13:1-10)

However, the greatest idol of our time -

worshiped by almost all people on earth - is money, greed, and the insatiable desire for wealth. Satan deceives the world by claiming that money has no ideology and no religion.

Enrichment - regardless of the means - has become the standard of success and earthly happiness.

But the Lord warned:

*"No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. **You cannot serve both God and money.**" (Matt. 6:24)*

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Luke 12:34)

Additionally, idols include false ideologies such as atheism and communism; philosophies that claim "God does not exist" or "God is dead"; ancient religions such as Islam, Buddhism, and Hinduism; and worldly idols such as hedonism, glamour, sorcery, witchcraft, the cult of sex, sexual immorality, obsession with luxury, and many others.

Revelation testifies about the most terrifying idol of the last days:

*"The dragon stood on the shore of the sea. And I saw a beast coming out of the sea. It had ten horns and seven heads, with ten crowns on its horns, and on each head a blasphemous name... **All inhabitants of the earth will worship the beast** - all whose names have not been written in the Lamb's book of life, the Lamb who was slain from the creation of the world..." (Rev. 13:1-10)*

Therefore, in these difficult times, all the saints are called to patiently keep the commandments of the Lord:

"Since you have kept my command to

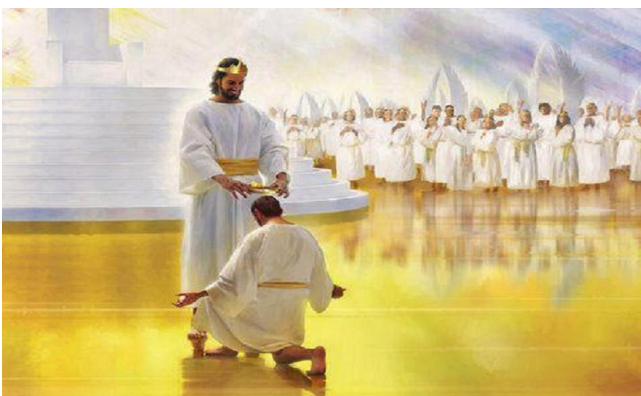
endure patiently, I will also keep you from the hour of trial that is going to come on the whole world to test the inhabitants of the earth.” (Rev. 3:10)

The Lord will preserve those who remain faithful to Him during the period of the Great Tribulation.

*“Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it, **because the time is near.**” (Rev. 1:3)*

Those who endure trials to the end will receive salvation and the great blessings of the Everlasting Gospel:

*“Do not be afraid of what you are about to suffer. I tell you, the devil will put some of you in prison to test you, and you will suffer persecution for ten days. **Be faithful, even to the point of death, and I will give you life as your victor’s crown.**” (Rev. 2:10)*



What Blessings Are Prepared for Us in the Truth of the Everlasting Gospel?

1 The blessing of receiving salvation during the Great Tribulation

*“For then there will be great distress, unequalled from the beginning of the world until now - and never to be equaled again. If those days had not been cut short, no one would survive, but **for the sake of the elect those days will be shortened.**” (Matt. 24:21-22)*

2 The blessing of fighting against Satan and overcoming him

*“Then I heard a loud voice in heaven say: ‘Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God, and the authority of his Messiah. For the accuser of our brothers and sisters, who accuses them before our God day and night, has been hurled down. **They triumphed over him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony;** they did not love their lives so much as to shrink from death.’” (Rev. 12:10-11)*

3 The blessing of taking part in the first resurrection

*“Blessed and holy are those who share in the first resurrection. The second death has no power over them, but **they will be priests of God and of Christ and will reign with him for a thousand years.**” (Rev. 20:6)*

4 The blessing of drinking the water of life

*“Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. **To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to eat from the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.**” (Rev. 2:7)*

“...Let the one who is thirsty come; and let the one who wishes take the free gift of the water of life.” (Rev. 22:17)

5 The blessing of standing with the Lamb on Mount Zion

*“Then I looked, and there before me was **the Lamb, standing on Mount Zion**, and with him 144,000 who had his name and his Father’s name written on their foreheads.” (Rev. 14:1)*

*“Then I saw ‘**a new heaven and a new earth,**’ for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. I saw **the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God**, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband.” (Rev. 21:1-2)*

6 The blessing of eternal life and the blessing of dwelling forever with the Lord God

*“Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. **The one who is victorious will not be hurt at all by the second death.**” (Rev. 2:11)*

*“And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, “**Look! God’s dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. ‘He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death’ or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.**”” (Rev. 21:3-4)*

7 The blessing of reigning with Jesus in the Kingdom of the Lord forever and ever

*“Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, as clear as crystal,... down the middle of the great street of the city. On each side of the river stood the tree of life, bearing twelve crops of fruit, yielding its fruit every month... No longer will there be any curse. **The throne of God and of the Lamb will be in the city, and his servants will serve him... and they will reign for ever and ever.**” (Rev. 22:1-5)*

With all my heart, I pray in the name of the coming Jesus Christ that all spiritual leaders, pastors, mentors, teachers, and all Christians may receive these wonderful blessings of the Everlasting Gospel.

“Look, I am coming soon! Blessed is the one who keeps the words of the prophecy written in this scroll.” (Rev. 22:7)

“I warn everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this scroll: If anyone adds anything to them, God will add to that person the plagues described in this scroll. And if anyone takes words away from this scroll of prophecy, God will take away from that person any share in the tree of life and in the Holy City, which are described in this scroll.” (Rev. 22:18-19)

Hallelujah!

“ He who testifies to these things says, ‘Yes, I am coming soon.’ Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.” (Rev. 22:20)



PRAYER TOPICS FOR THE LAST DAYS

*“So do not worry, saying,
‘What shall we eat?’ or ‘What shall we drink?’ or ‘What shall we wear?’
For the pagans run after all these things,
and your heavenly Father knows that you need them.
But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness,
and all these things will be given to you as well.” (Matthew 6:31-33)*

1. Pray that the truth of the last days may spread throughout the whole world:

- that it may be proclaimed to every country, tribe, people, and language of the world; (Matt. 24:14)
- that those who receive the blessing to read and hear the word of the Everlasting Gospel may know it, understand it, and keep it faithfully to the end; (Matt. 1:3)
- that all who have accepted the Everlasting Gospel may receive the blessing to take part in the mission of the last days and to prophesy again the truth to the whole world. (Rev. 10:11, 14:6-7)

2. Pray that all God’s servants and saints may recognize that now is the time to concentrate on deep prayer:

- that they may all unite in fervent prayer and fasting, in which the Lord God delights; (Joel 1:13-14, Isa. 58:6-12)
- that they may receive from the Lord clear answers and revelations concerning the last days; (Rev. 8:13, 9:13-21)

- that they may pray day and night like watchmen, reminding the Lord about Israel until He restores it; (Isa. 62:6-7)
- that they may not commit the sin of ceasing to pray before God. (1Sam. 12:23)

3. Pray that all God’s servants and saints may have their spiritual eyes and spiritual ears opened for deep, continual prayer:

- that those who have ears may hear what the Lord is saying to the churches; (Matt. 13:9, Rev. 2:7, 2:11, 2:17, 2:29, 3:2, 3:13, 3:22)
- that their spiritual eyes may be opened, the eyes of the Seven Spirits of God; (Rev. 4:5, 5:6, Matt. 6:22)
- that their spiritual eyes may be opened, the eyes of the Seven Spirits of God: and in the Spirit may see, hear, and understand with their hearts; (Matt. 13:14-17, Rev. 10:7)
- that those who hear the voice of Jesus today may open the door to Him and remain with Him. (Rev. 3:20)

4. Pray for the awakening of the spiritual world from deep spiritual sleep, and for the spiritual restoration of the Church:

- that those who are spiritually dead, like dry bones, may come to life again by the Spirit of God; (Ezek. 37:1-14)
- that they may personally turn away from every sin, evil, and idolatry; (Rev. 2:14, 2:20, 18:4)
- that they may return to God, pray, fast, remain sober-minded, and stay spiritually alert in these last days; (1Pet. 4:7, Matt. 24:36-44)
- that they may never lose heart in any trials or difficulties, but overcome to the end through continual prayer; (Luke 18:1-8)
- that they may continually fill the bowls of prayer before the throne of God for the fulfillment of God's will. (Rev. 5:8, 8:3-5)

5. Pray that all the saints may receive salvation and protection during the coming Great Tribulation: (Rev. 12:6, 9:4)

- that for the sake of the elect, the Lord may shorten the days of that terrible tribulation, such as has not occurred since the beginning of the world and never will again; (Matt. 24:21-22)
- that their flight may not take place in winter or on the Sabbath; (Matt. 24:20)
- that in everything they may strictly obey the Word of God, for "the righteous will live by faith"



(Hab. 2:4), and yet faith without deeds is dead; (Jas. 2:14-20)

- that those who endure to the end may receive salvation; (Matt. 24:13)
- that they may fear God and receive freedom and healing; (Rev. 14:6-7, Mal. 4:1-4)
- that the Lord may deliver the righteous from many troubles. (Ps. 33:19)

6. Pray that God's servants and all the saints may prepare themselves for the second coming of Jesus Christ:

- that they may welcome Him as the long-awaited Bridegroom, like the five wise virgins who prepared oil for their lamps in advance; (Matt. 25:1-13)
- that they may be clothed in clean garments, symbolizing the righteousness of the saints; (Rev. 7:13-17, 19:7-8)
- that they may become faithful servants who give spiritual food at the proper time to those entrusted to them; (Matt. 24:45-51)
- that they may continually remain watchful in prayer and fasting (Matt. 24:36-44), preparing the way of the Lord's second coming in prayer, just as Simeon and Anna prepared the way for His first coming. (Luke 2:25-38)

7. Pray that satanic powers opposing the spread of the truth of the Everlasting Gospel and the second coming of Jesus Christ may be destroyed:

- that the powers of false prophets who come in sheep's clothing but

inwardly are ferocious wolves may be destroyed; (Matt. 7:15)

- that the powers of false prophets who will arise in the last days and deceive many may be destroyed; (Matt. 24:11)
- that the powers of false messiahs and false prophets who will perform great signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect may be destroyed; (Matt. 24:24)
- that the powers of the father of lies-the devil (John. 8:44), the spirit of falsehood (1Kgs. 22:22), the ancient serpent who deceived Eve and now deceives the whole world (Gen. 3:1-5, Rev.12:9), and the three impure spirits like frogs coming out of the mouth of the dragon, the beast, and the false prophet, may be destroyed; (Rev. 16:13-14)
- that the powers of spiritual stars that poison people with the bitter water of false teaching may be destroyed; (Rev. 8:10-11)
- that the powers of all idols, worldly cares, the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life -every thing that turns our hearts away from the Lord God - may be destroyed. (1John. 2:15-17)

8. Pray that true warriors of Christ may arise, who will be spiritually armed, fight against satanic power, and remain faithful to the Lord even unto death: (Rev. 14:1-5,12:11)

- that they, like Moses and the apostle Paul, may receive spiritual provision in the wilderness; (Rev. 12:14)

- that, following the example of the apostle Paul, they may not value their lives for the sake of preaching the Gospel; (Acts 20:24)
- that they may fight against satanic power even unto death and overcome by the blood of the Lamb; (Rev. 12:11)
- that the Lord may send as many workers as possible into the harvest of the last days. (Matt. 9:37-38)

9. Pray that the final harvest and the judgment of the Lord may be fulfilled:

- that the full grain may be separated from the chaff, (Matt.13:24-30, 36-43), the sheep from the goats (Matt. 25: 32 -33), faithful servants from unfaithful ones (Matt. 24:45-46),and wise virgins from foolish ones; (Matt. 25:1-13)
- that the weeds may be thrown into the fire (Matt. 13:30), the goats sent to the left, (Matt. 25:33), unfaithful servants punished (Matt. 24:48-51), and foolish virgins shut out of the wedding banquet. (Matt. 25:10-13)

10. Pray that true servants and saints may overcome to the end and receive all the blessings of the Everlasting Gospel:

- that all who overcome may receive great spiritual blessings promised by the Lord; (Rev. 2:,3:)
- that all who overcome may receive the blessing to eat from the tree of life; (Rev. 2:7)
- that all who overcome may receive the blessing of not being hurt by the



- second death; (Rev. 2:11)
- that all who overcome may receive the blessing to eat the hidden manna and to receive a white stone with a new name written on it; (Rev. 2:17)
 - that all who overcome may receive the blessing of authority over the nations - to rule them with an iron scepter and dash them to pieces like pottery; (Rev. 2:26-27)
 - that all who overcome may receive the blessing to be clothed in white garments and to have their names remain in the book of life; (Rev. 3:5)
 - that all who overcome may receive the blessing to become a pillar in the temple of God; (Rev. 3:12)
 - that all who overcome may receive the blessing to sit with Christ on His throne, just as Jesus Christ overcame and sat down with His Father on His throne; (Rev. 3:21)
 - that all who overcome may receive the blessing to take part in the first resurrection, the blessing to dwell forever with the Lord God, and the blessing to reign with Jesus Christ in the Kingdom of the Lord forever and ever. (Rev. 22:1-5).
